The Center

Our Impact:

In one year, The Center counted more than 85,000 individual interactions across all sites and programs. This includes our classes, support groups, youth hangouts, social events, and every time someone comes through our front doors seeking resources or a safe, affirming space.

All of The Center's activities work to reduce isolation and loneliness. Programs and social events provide LGBTQ+ people with safe environments for meeting others with similar experiences who understand their challenges, reducing feelings of loneliness and building lasting friendships.

The Center provides affirming mental health services through group therapy programs and counseling available to individuals, couples, and families. All are tailored to the specific needs of LGBTQ+ individuals and aim to reduce anxiety, depression, and suicidal thoughts.

The Center connects people to resources and educational programs. Our locations are hubs connecting individuals to needed services like healthcare, legal assistance, housing support, and employment opportunities. Educational programs enrich individual lives and increase understanding of LGBTQ+ issues within the community and broader public.

The Center strengthens families and personal relationships with programming and resources, in English and Spanish, that break down barriers, foster understanding, and help families accept and support their LGBTQ+ loved ones.

The Center supports positive youth development with peer support groups, counseling, social activities, and leadership opportunities. Young people gain self-confidence while learning to navigate coming out, handling discrimination, and growing as their authentic selves.

The Center is meeting the unique needs of a large and varied LGBTQ+ population with programs and supportive spaces that align with our mission of creating vibrant community by helping LGBTQ+ people along their way, including support around food insecurity and behavioral health, and specific programs for youth and family, seniors, women, and transgender and gender expansive individuals.

Addressing the Need

LGBTQ+ people often face unique behavioral health challenges compared to the general population, such as higher rates of depression, anxiety, and suicidal thoughts. The community needs supportive behavioral health services that acknowledge their unique experiences and affirm their strength.

The Center's Scott Hines Behavioral Health Clinic offers individual, couples, family, and group therapy. Services are available on a sliding scale based on income to make sure everyone can access care.

Our Impact

The clinic's affirmative approach to therapy helps clients navigate social interactions, build meaningful relationships, and improve their overall quality of life. Outcomes include reduced anxiety, isolation, and stigma around mental health issues.



The Center's Community Food Bank

Addressing the Need

One in seven Coachella Valley adults has had to cut the size of meals or skip meals because they couldn't afford food, according to a 2022 HARC survey. That equates to 48,670 food insecure residents.

While The Center's Community Food Bank serves all residents, Feeding America notes that LGBTQ+ adults are disproportionately affected by food insecurity.

Our Impact

The Center's Community Food Bank provides fresh and free food through its weekly distribution, including produce, protein, dairy, baked goods, and pantry items to food insecure community members. A Community Health Worker assesses all new clients to determine if additional services are needed, ensuring we are connecting people to the resources that will help them thrive.

Addressing the Need

The Kaiser Family Foundation study “Community Centers as Important Venues for LGBTQ Health Promotion” found that LGBTQ centers, with their safe spaces and social support, are essential to improving health outcomes, reducing feelings of isolation, and fostering a sense of community.

Our Impact

Programs for seniors, women, trans* and gender expansive people, and youth and families raise visibility for these populations and create affirming spaces and opportunities for meaningful connections between participants with similar experience who otherwise may feel lonely and isolated.

Participants gain a greater sense of belonging through programs that improve mental health and encourage an active lifestyle. They are likely to form bonds and look out for one another, strengthening the community's overall resiliency.

Addressing the Need

The 2016 Youth Participatory Action Research (YPAR) report of more than 600 Eastern Coachella Valley young people identified that their top wishes for the community include LGBTQ+ friendly spaces, information and services, as well as mental health support.

The Center Coachella is dedicated to being a safe and affirming space for LGBTQ+ young people living in the Eastern Coachella Valley with opportunities for social engagement and after-school drop-in activities. Spanish-language family programs provide community and culturally competent support to the parents and guardians of LGBTQ+ young people.

Our Impact

The Center Coachella is creating opportunities for LGBTQ+ young people to express their identities, connect with peers, and find support and acceptance, significantly reducing isolation and loneliness. Seeing happy and successful LGBTQ+ adults help youth build self-esteem and envision a positive future for themselves.

Family members gain support and practical advice from others with similar experiences. Supportive families become advocates for the wider LGBTQ+ community, working to make schools and other community spaces welcoming for everyone.


Volunteer Hours Last Year
